



TOCHA FILMES is an independent production company based in **São Paulo, Brazil**, creating award-winning audiovisual content across multiple platforms with a dedicated focus on social and environmental responsibility. Known for transforming complex, urgent issues into visually compelling films with dynamic and accessible storytelling, the company has earned over 20 international awards and selections at prestigious festivals worldwide.

It has produced more than 2,780 minutes of content released on TV, digital platforms, and in cinemas, and currently has approximately 1,300 minutes in production. Since 2018, TOCHA FILMES has maintained carbon neutrality across all productions and launched its own free streaming platform, TOCHA PLAY, extending its commitment to accessibility, sustainability, and positive social impact.

Under his leadership, the company has produced award-winning films, TV series, animations, books, and podcasts in partnership with Globo Filmes, GloboNews, Canal OFF, and TV Cultura.

Sylvio combines strategic vision with creative purpose, using film as a tool to connect people, values, and the planet, driving awareness and positive change through meaningful audiovisual experiences.

Through their voices and experiences, it celebrates the women shaping the future of conservation in one of the world's most biodiverse nations.

It aims to raise awareness about gender inequality in STEM fields and highlight women's pioneering roles in exact sciences.

Category: ESG, Circular Economy, Sustainability.

Narrated by Brazilian singer Lenine, the film challenges viewers to embrace personal responsibility for Earth's future.




8_THE TRASCARIOCA TRAIL

BRAZIL, 2024, 5 X 26 MIN.

Category: History, Travel, Adventure.

This TV documentary series follows a 180-kilometer trail crossing Rio de Janeiro from Barra de Guaratiba to Morro da Urca, at the foot of Sugarloaf Mountain. As Latin America's largest long-distance urban trail, it reveals the city's blend of nature, history, and culture. Across four episodes, it explores nine protected areas, linking forests, beaches, and neighborhoods while highlighting landmarks and landscapes that reflect Rio's harmony with nature.
